Surviving Holy Week

While Holy Week contains some of the most significant days in the Christian year, for many pastors, the last push from Palm Sunday through Easter is a steep uphill climb! Even if the youth or lay leadership participate or lead worship, the minister still is responsible for coordinating from 4 to 6 services in just 8 days (sometimes 5 of them in 72 hours).

The Holy Week schedule is not a problem to be solved but an opportunity to be embraced. At the very least one may intentionally carve out daily Sabbath time to renew the spirit and strengthen the soul. Some have gone as far as to set aside the Wednesday of Holy Week as an intentional “day of preparation”. Others have met with a group of supportive colleagues each morning of the week for breakfast.

In my previous call, the difference in my own journey was the “discovery” of the rich tradition surrounding the Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday. While the Sunrise Service comes out of the Moravian tradition and dates to the Middle Ages, the Easter Vigil traces its roots to the earliest days of the Church.

The service may be observed in diverse ways. Some even include the Sacrament of Baptism and/or the Renewal of Baptismal Vows. There is wisdom in keeping the evening simple. Those present may take turns in reading the texts. It is moving to hear again the Creation, the Flood, Abraham and Isaac, the Red Sea, the Valley of Dry Bones, and the Resurrection. It is the story of salvation ... when we all most need it!

By 1:00 on Easter afternoon, most ministers are physically and emotionally drained. They, however, may avoid spiritual weariness by digging deeper into the wonder and mystery of Holy Week.

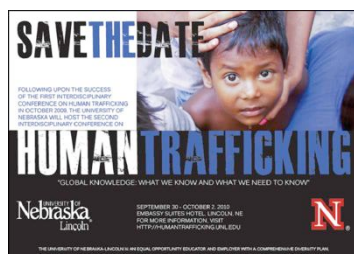

Position Description:

To serve in ministry Latino/Hispanic people in South Omaha, NE particularly around the Castelar Presbyterian Church. He or she should possess the following skills:

- be fluent in Spanish and English
- be willing and able to strengthen youth and family ministries—particularly the monthly neighborhood Kid's Night
- identify and respond to the social, health, and economic needs of the neighborhood.
- lead worship services in Spanish and English

Site Information: Castelar Presbyterian Church is an historic "immigrant congregation". For many years it served German then Czech people who settled in South Omaha. It once was a thriving congregation with the largest Sunday School in the state. Currently, membership has dwindled to 30-40 aging members. Seven years ago, "The Four Old White Guys", founded a monthly social evening (Kid's Night) for nearby predominately Mexican heritage girls and boys. Most evenings there are games, children's worship, and pizza. Recently, we have been blessed with 60+ children most evenings. Our congregational members have a strong desire to support a third transformation in becoming a neighborhood congregation again. With the prayful and financial support of Missouri Valley Presbytery, sister congregations, and many supportive individuals we would like to become a bilingual and bicultural congregation once again.

Spotlight on Haiti

Resurrection From the Rubble!

The Resurrection Dance Theatre of Haiti is an internationally recognized dance troupe of former orphaned street children and child slaves in Haiti.

Presented by The Haitian Timoun Foundation and The Resurrection Dance Theatre Of Haiti the dance troop **is coming to Omaha to raise funds to rebuild group home.** The troupe uses drumming and dance to vibrantly tell their story and lift up hearts. It is a liberating message that with God all things are possible.

The Saint Joseph's Family, home to this troupe, was ready to celebrate twenty-five years of life-changing mission to street and vulnerable children in Haiti on January 31st. Formed under the leadership of Michael Geilenfeld, the family grew to three centers in Haiti. Its mission transforming Haitian boys from being the rejected ones in Haiti to being among the very best of servant-leaders, giving back by reaching out and multiplying themselves in others. Their work has changed the lives of countless Haitian children, boys and girls and even those with disabilities, to be the best they can be. Recently, with the HTF's support, the St. Joseph's Family built and opened a school for the very poorest of the poor, giving children with no hope a chance to realize their dreams. Together these two organizations had a vision of a dental and medical clinic in the town of Jacmel, a community outreach center, a coffee project and a mechanics' school to give the family a needful enterprise, and a water project that would provide clean water to the community.

On January 12th, Haiti was devastated by an earthquake, and the Saint Joseph's Family was hit very hard. Buildings crashed. People were hurt. Not only did they lose their home, these young dancers also lost most of their costumes and drums. What they did not lose was their determination to make a difference. They have sewn new costumes, repaired damaged drums and are now ready to dance the good news of resurrection once again.

This event is being presented as a testimony to the Saint Joseph's Family and as a plea to help us raise up the Saint Joseph's Family from the rubble. Come join us in this dance of new life. Offer them your encouragement, your helping hands and your financial resources. By our raising up Saint Joseph's to be better than before we will also be raising up Haiti.

Editor's Note: Kris Adler travels to Montreat, North Carolina each May to attend the Annual Recreation Workshop. She told me that for many years, the Presbytery of Charleston-Atlantic has sponsored a few conference participants from Haiti; specifically young men who work with the orphaned children who reside at St. Joseph's Family group home. All of these young men were residents of St. Joseph's as children. Some of the young men who attend the conference are part of this dance troupe. Kris is excited about their trip to Omaha to raise funds to rebuild the group home and she hopes you will make time in your schedule to attend their offerings!
