The Pastor as Minor Poet

Dr. M. Craig Barnes is the Robert Meneilly Professor of Leadership and Ministry at Pittsburgh Theological Seminary. In addition to his teaching ministry, he is the Senior Pastor at Shadyside Presbyterian Church in Pittsburgh. Previously, he served as the Senior Pastor of the National Presbyterian Church in Washington, D.C. He earned his doctorate at the University of Chicago where his advisor was Dr. Martin Marty.

He is the author of several books, including: *Searching for Home: Spirituality for Restless Souls* (Brazos Press, 2006); *Sacred Thirst: Finding God in the Desert of our Longings* (Zondervan, 2001); and *Hustling God: Why We Work So Hard for What God Wants to Give* (Zondervan, 1999). A well-known Presbyterian speaker, Craig is also the author of numerous published articles.

During his lectures, Dr. Barnes will address themes from his latest book, *The Pastor as Minor Poet: Texts and Subtexts Within the Pastoral Life* (Eerdmans, 2008). Readers have praised this work in pastoral theology for its wisdom, grace and encouragement to them in their own ministries.
